

**Opinions on Smoking Issues in the  
Counties of Albany, Rensselaer,  
And Schenectady Counties**

*A Survey Conducted April 21-July 8, 2013*

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# Albany County 2013

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## Smoking Behavior

- 42% of Albany County residents have smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their life.
  - ‘Ever smoked’ is greatest among those 60 years of age and older (59%) and least among those under the age of 30 (13%).
  - Those without a college degree have ever smoked at a rate greater than those with a degree and those earning less than \$50,000 a year (48%) have ever smoked at a rate greater than either those earning between \$50 and \$100k (41%) or those earning over \$100k (37%).
- Today 16% of Albany residents smoke. Three-quarters of the smokers or 12% of all citizens smoke everyday while 4% of all citizens smoke on some days.
  - Overall smoking rates are approximately 25% for adults between 30 and 60 years of age as well as those with less than a college degree or those earning less than \$50k.
- Smokers in Albany County tend to purchase their cigarettes at either gas stations (33%) or convenience stores (27%).

## Attitudes Towards Smoking

- 82% of all citizens do not allow smoking anywhere inside their home.
  - That rate is higher among women (86%) than among men (77%).
  - 47% of current smokers do not allow smoking in their homes at all while 24% of smokers allow smoking in some places or at some times in their home.
  - 92% of those with children in their household do not allow smoking in their home at any time.
- 77% of all citizens do not allow smoking in their vehicle(s).
  - 36% of smokers prohibit smoking in their vehicle(s) while 31% allow smoking at some times or in some vehicles and 17% permit smoking in all their vehicles. 16% of smokers do not have a family vehicle.
- Asked whether they favor or oppose an expansion of the current clean indoor air law to include each of six different public areas, between 55% and 84% are in favor. In each case, women are more likely than men to favor the expansion. Specifically:
  - 84% are in favor of expanding the law to playgrounds including 79% of smokers.
  - 79% are in favor of expanding the law to municipal pools including 71% of smokers.
  - 69% are in favor of expanding the law to the areas around building entry ways including only 40% of smokers.

- 61% are in favor of expanding the law to public parks and outdoor recreation areas including only 36% of smokers.
- 59% are in favor of expanding the law to public beaches including only 34% of smokers.
- 55% are in favor of expanding the law to ski resorts including only 32% of smokers.

## Display and Sale of Tobacco Products

- Asked whether they think each of four different types of stores should or should not sell tobacco products including cigarettes and cigars, a majority of all citizens think tobacco products should be sold in gas stations, convenience stores and grocery stores but a majority do not think tobacco products should be sold in pharmacies. Specifically:
  - 61% say tobacco products should not be sold in pharmacies while 36% of all citizens but 63% of smokers do think they should be.
  - 73% of all citizens, 93% of smokers and 68% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at gas stations.
  - 71% of all citizens, 95% of smokers and 65% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at convenience stores.
  - 58% of all citizens, 74% of smokers and 51% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at grocery stores.
- 68% of all county residents and 61% of smokers, think that tobacco products should not be sold in stores that are located near schools.
- 60% support a regulation that would ban the sale of tobacco products in stores that are located near schools. A plurality of smokers favor this potential regulation with 47% supporting it and 40% opposed.
- 46% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would limit the number of stores that could sell tobacco in their community while 34% oppose that regulation. Smokers oppose the limitation of stores by 57% to 24%. Of those that have never smoked, this regulation is favored by 54% to 26%.
- 58% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would ban the sale of all tobacco products in pharmacies.
  - 30% of all residents and 54% of smokers oppose this potential ban.
- 77% of county residents have over the past 30 days noticed packs of cigarettes or cigars visible behind the cash register or in other areas of stores at least occasionally.
- 61% of all residents including 47% of smokers think tobacco products should not be visible in stores.
- 58% of county residents are in favor of a requirement being instituted in New York that would require retailers to keep their tobacco products out of customers' view.
  - 24% oppose this requirement.

- Smokers are split with 35% supporting this requirement and 32% opposing it.

## Attitudes towards Teen Smoking

- 73% of all residents, and 63% of smokers, think teen smoking is a significant problem in their community.
- Majorities agree that:
  - Advertising in local stores make teens more likely to smoke (55%).
  - Tobacco products that are visible in stores make teens more likely to smoke (52%).
  - Teens would smoke less if tobacco products were not visible in stores (51%).

## Methods and Nature of the Sample

Using random digit-dialing (RDD) interviews were conducted with 364 residents of Albany County. Of those, 127 were conducted via cell phone from a sample of cell numbers drawn from a seventeen county area including the counties of Albany, Clinton, Columbia, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hamilton, Montgomery, Otsego, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington. Completed interviews from both landline and cell phones calls were merged and weighted by known age and gender characteristics so as to enhance representativeness.

Data is reported with a margin of error of +/- 5.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

## Effect of Cell Phone Calls on Findings

For the first time in the five replications of this study, cell phones were included in the sampling. Across the 17 counties, 19% of the interviews were conducted via cell phones. While potential systematic differences that may exist between those respondents that can be reached via cell phone rather than on a landline are mitigated through weighting the responses by age of respondent, it is important to consider the impact that the inclusion of cell phone respondents may have had on some findings. Generally, cell phone respondents tend to be younger, more male and have a higher percentage of minorities than a landline only sample. We find that across the 17 County area, that was the case and also we find that the current smoking rate of those we spoke with via cell phone is higher at 22% as compared with a rate of 13% among those we spoke with on landlines.

It is fair to say that when comparing this year's smoking rate to that of previous years either across the 17 counties or in Albany that the rate this year is to some degree inflated, albeit more accurately, by the inclusion of cell phone respondents.

In Albany, the overall current smoking rate is 16%. Among cell phone respondents it is 22% while among those reached via landlines the smoking rate is only 11%.

## 17 County Comparison

SRI conducted the identical survey in each of 17 counties – Albany, Clinton, Columbia, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hamilton, Montgomery, Otsego, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington – this spring/summer. The following table shows the results across each of those counties for five important questions:

- The current smoking rate computed as the percent of residents that smoke now either every day or some days from among those that indicate having smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their life.
- Support for a regulation (either strongly or somewhat in favor) being imposed in New York similar to one in Canada that would require tobacco retailers to keep their products out of customers' view.
- Support for a regulation that would limit the number of stores that could sell tobacco in their community.
- Support for a regulation that would ban the sale of tobacco products in stores that are located near schools.
- Support for a regulation that would ban the sale of all tobacco products in pharmacies.
- In Albany, the smoking rate at 16% is slightly below the 17 County average of 18%.

- Albany residents are in favor of a regulation that would require keeping tobacco products out of customers' view at a rate, 58%, consistent with the 17 County average.
- Albany residents tend to support limiting the number of stores that sell tobacco, banning sales near schools and banning the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies at rates greater than the 17 County average.
- Included in the table as well are the responses from the entire sample of nearly 6000 respondents weighted by county population size so as to generate a sample representative of the 17 county region. Compared to this 17 County universe sample, the smoking rate of Albany is one point lower.

# Rensselaer County 2013

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## Smoking Behavior

- 50% of Rensselaer County residents have smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their life.
  - ‘Ever smoked’ is greatest among those 60 years of age and older (62%) and least among those under the age of 30 (28%).
  - Those without a college degree have ever smoked at a rate greater than those with a degree and those earning less than \$50,000 a year (68%) have ever smoked at a rate greater than either those earning between \$50 and \$100k (49%) or those earning over \$100k (34%).
- Today 18% of Rensselaer residents smoke. Two-thirds of the smokers or 12% of all citizens smoke everyday while 6% of all citizens smoke on some days.
- Smokers in Rensselaer County tend to purchase their cigarettes at either gas stations (20%) or convenience stores (46%).

## Attitudes Towards Smoking

- 79% of all citizens do not allow smoking anywhere inside their home.
  - That rate is higher among men (84%) than among women (75%).
  - 50% of current smokers do not allow smoking in their homes at all while 26% of smokers allow smoking in some places or at some times in their home.
  - 85% of those with children in their household do not allow smoking in their home at any time.
- 72% of all citizens do not allow smoking in their vehicle(s).
  - 23% of smokers prohibit smoking in their vehicle(s) while 35% allow smoking at some times or in some vehicles and 31% permit smoking in all their vehicles. 12% of smokers do not have a family vehicle.
- Asked whether they favor or oppose an expansion of the current clean indoor air law to include each of six different public areas, between 51% and 80% are in favor. In each case, women are more likely than men to favor the expansion. Specifically:
  - 80% are in favor of expanding the law to playgrounds including 77% of smokers.
  - 77% are in favor of expanding the law to municipal pools including 67% of smokers.
  - 69% are in favor of expanding the law to the areas around building entry ways including 68% of smokers.
  - 58% are in favor of expanding the law to public beaches including only 30% of smokers.

- 52% are in favor of expanding the law to public parks and outdoor recreation areas including only 34% of smokers.
- 51% are in favor of expanding the law to ski resorts including just 26% of smokers.

## Display and Sale of Tobacco Products

- Asked whether they think each of four different types of stores should or should not sell tobacco products including cigarettes and cigars, a majority of all citizens think tobacco products should be sold in gas stations, convenience stores and grocery stores but a majority do not think tobacco products should be sold in pharmacies. Specifically:
  - 59% say tobacco products should not be sold in pharmacies while 40% of all citizens but 51% of smokers do think they should be.
  - 80% of all citizens, 92% of smokers and 78% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at gas stations.
  - 79% of all citizens, 87% of smokers and 77% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at convenience stores.
  - 67% of all citizens, 75% of smokers and 64% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at grocery stores.
- 60% of all county residents and 40% of smokers, think that tobacco products should not be sold in stores that are located near schools.
- 48% support a regulation that would ban the sale of tobacco products in stores that are located near schools. A majority of smokers oppose this potential regulation with 37% supporting it and 55% opposed.
- 37% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would limit the number of stores that could sell tobacco in their community while 41% oppose that regulation. Smokers oppose the limitation of stores by 54% to 28%. Of those that have never smoked, this regulation is favored by 42% to 35%.
- 53% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would ban the sale of all tobacco products in pharmacies.
  - 34% of all residents and 40% of smokers oppose this potential ban.
- 78% of county residents have over the past 30 days noticed packs of cigarettes or cigars visible behind the cash register or in other areas of stores at least occasionally.
- 50% of all residents including 30% of smokers think tobacco products should not be visible in stores.
- 46% of county residents are in favor of a requirement being instituted in New York that would require retailers to keep their tobacco products out of customers' view.
  - 27% oppose this requirement.
  - A plurality of smokers oppose with 22% supporting this requirement and 43% opposing it.

## Attitudes Towards Teen Smoking

- 67% of all residents, and 62% of smokers, think teen smoking is a significant problem in their community.
- Residents are split on the following teen smoking issues:
  - Advertising in local stores make teens more likely to smoke: 49% agree while 45% disagree.
  - Tobacco products that are visible in stores make teens more likely to smoke: 45% agree while 47% disagree.
  - Teens would smoke less if tobacco products were not visible in stores: 42% agree while 49% disagree.

## Methods and Nature of the Sample

Using random digit-dialing (RDD) interviews were conducted with 353 residents of Rensselaer County. Of those, 67 were conducted via cell phone from a sample of cell numbers drawn from a seventeen county area including the counties of Albany, Clinton, Columbia, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hamilton, Montgomery, Otsego, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington. Completed interviews from both landline and cell phones calls were merged and weighted by known age and gender characteristics so as to enhance representativeness.

Data is reported with a margin of error of +/- 5.2 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

- Rensselaer residents tend to support banning the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies at a rate consistent with the 17 County average.
- Included in the table as well are the responses from the entire sample of nearly 6000 respondents weighted by county population size so as to generate a sample representative of the 17 county region. Compared to this 17 County universe sample, the smoking rate of Rensselaer is one point higher.

# Schenectady County 2013

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## Smoking Behavior

- 50% of Schenectady County residents have smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their life.
  - ‘Ever smoked’ is greatest among those 45-59 years of age and older (57%) and least among those under the age of 30 (39%).
  - Those without a college degree have ever smoked at a rate greater than those with a degree and those earning less than \$50,000 a year (58%) have ever smoked at a rate greater than either those earning between \$50 and \$100k (48%) or those earning over \$100k (49%).
- Today 19% of Schenectady residents smoke. Three-quarters of the smokers or 15% of all citizens smoke everyday while 4% of all citizens smoke on some days.
- Smokers in Schenectady County tend to purchase their cigarettes at either gas stations (52%) or convenience stores (35%).

## Attitudes Towards Smoking

- 86% of all citizens do not allow smoking anywhere inside their home.
  - That rate is higher among men (88%) than among women (84%).
  - 59% of current smokers do not allow smoking in their homes at all while 14% of smokers allow smoking in some places or at some times in their home.
  - 91% of those with children in their household do not allow smoking in their home at any time.
- 76% of all citizens do not allow smoking in their vehicle(s).
  - 34% of smokers prohibit smoking in their vehicle(s) while 24% allow smoking at some times or in some vehicles and 16% permit smoking in all their vehicles. 26% of smokers do not have a family vehicle.
- Asked whether they favor or oppose an expansion of the current clean indoor air law to include each of six different public areas, between 54% and 79% are in favor. Specifically:
  - 79% are in favor of expanding the law to playgrounds including 72% of smokers.
  - 73% are in favor of expanding the law to municipal pools including 69% of smokers.
  - 65% are in favor of expanding the law to the areas around building entry ways including 53% of smokers.
  - 62% are in favor of expanding the law to public beaches including 55% of smokers.
  - 59% are in favor of expanding the law to public parks and outdoor recreation areas including only 42% of smokers.

- 54% are in favor of expanding the law to ski resorts including only 43% of smokers.

## Display and Sale of Tobacco Products

- Asked whether they think each of four different types of stores should or should not sell tobacco products including cigarettes and cigars, a majority of all citizens think tobacco products should be sold in gas stations, convenience stores and grocery stores but a majority do not think tobacco products should be sold in pharmacies. Specifically:
  - 63% say tobacco products should not be sold in pharmacies while 35% of all citizens but 43% of smokers do think they should be.
  - 74% of all citizens, 95% of smokers and 67% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at gas stations.
  - 72% of all citizens, 92% of smokers and 67% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at convenience stores.
  - 56% of all citizens, 70% of smokers and 48% of those that do not and have never smoked, think tobacco products should be sold at grocery stores.
- 69% of all county residents and 56% of smokers, think that tobacco products should not be sold in stores that are located near schools.
- 56% support a regulation that would ban the sale of tobacco products in stores that are located near schools. A majority of smokers oppose this potential regulation with 54% opposed and 32% supporting it.
- 42% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would limit the number of stores that could sell tobacco in their community while 41% oppose that regulation. Smokers oppose the limitation of stores by 68% to 23%. Of those that have never smoked, this regulation is favored by 51% to 29%.
- 52% of all residents are in favor of a regulation that would ban the sale of all tobacco products in pharmacies.
  - 34% of all residents and 44% of smokers oppose this potential ban.
- 71% of county residents have over the past 30 days noticed packs of cigarettes or cigars visible behind the cash register or in other areas of stores at least occasionally.
- 57% of all residents including 35% of smokers think tobacco products should not be visible in stores.
- 59% of county residents are in favor of a requirement being instituted in New York that would require retailers to keep their tobacco products out of customers' view.
  - 22% oppose this requirement.
  - Smokers are split with 40% supporting this requirement and 42% opposing it.

## Methods and Nature of the Sample

Using random digit-dialing (RDD) interviews were conducted with 356 residents of Schenectady County. Of those, 96 were conducted via cell phone from a sample of cell numbers drawn from a seventeen county area including the counties of Albany, Clinton, Columbia, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hamilton, Montgomery, Otsego, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington. Completed interviews from both landline and cell phones calls were merged and weighted by known age and gender characteristics so as to enhance representativeness.

Data is reported with a margin of error of +/- 5.2 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

- The current smoking rate computed as the percent of residents that smoke now either every day or some days from among those that indicate having smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their life.
- Support for a regulation (either strongly or somewhat in favor) being imposed in New York similar to one in Canada that would require tobacco retailers to keep their products out of customers' view.
- Support for a regulation that would limit the number of stores that could sell tobacco in their community.
- Support for a regulation that would ban the sale of tobacco products in stores that are located near schools.
- Support for a regulation that would ban the sale of all tobacco products in pharmacies.
- In Schenectady, the smoking rate at 19% is consistent with the 17 County average of 18%.
- Schenectady residents are in favor of a regulation that would require keeping tobacco products out of customers view at a rate, 59%, consistent with the 17 County average.

- Schenectady residents tend to support limiting the number of stores that sell tobacco, banning sales near schools and banning the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies at rates equal to the 17 County average.
- Included in the table as well are the responses from the entire sample of nearly 6000 respondents weighted by county population size so as to generate a sample representative of the 17 county region. Compared to this 17 County universe sample, the smoking rate of Schenectady is two points higher.
